

Australian Volunteers Program at a glance July 2019 – June 2020

The Australian Volunteers Program matches skilled Australians with organisations across 26 countries to help those organisations to deliver on their own objectives.

In 2019-20 the Australian Volunteers Program made significant progress towards all three program outcomes: supporting our partner organisations to achieve their development objectives; promoting the value of international volunteering; and supporting the personal and professional development of our volunteers.

The program recruited, mobilised and supported 802 volunteers to deliver 933 assignments in 26 countries. The program also developed stronger relationships with a more diverse cohort of partners, supporting 572 partner organisations in this period.


Forty-five partner workshops were held, 187 partnership plans were developed, and 85 Australian organisations supported in-country partners.

The program demonstrated strong crisis management in response to the impacts of COVID-19, including the repatriation of 464 volunteers and dependents. The program also quickly adjusted in response to the new context. The design and roll out of a remote volunteering model was fast tracked, and a volunteer Talent Pool was established, with over 700 candidates by 30 June 2020.


The program supported 802 Australians to volunteer, completing 933 assignments. 131 family members accompanied volunteers on overseas assignments. 418 assignments started this year and 515 continued assignments from previous years.








