Australian Volunteers Program at a glance July 2020 – June 2021



The Australian Volunteers Program has continued to support the locally-led development of hundreds of partner organisations across the Indo-Pacific region. Due to the ongoing impacts of COVID-19, the program has introduced new ways to provide this support.

In 2020-21, the Australian Volunteers Program made significant progress, including strengthening partnerships, adapting delivery, and exploring new ways to support local volunteering capacity and future program resilience.

This period has been characterised by the unprecedented impacts of COVID-19, which required the program to navigate high levels of uncertainty in all countries it operates in while also adapting program delivery.

The program supported 224 partner organisations through 343 volunteer assignments.

The program funded 102 small grants to contribute to the capacity development objectives of partner organisations, as well as facilitating a range of networking and mutual learning events.

During the year, DFAT commissioned an independent evaluation which found that the program was highly relevant to the development needs of overseas partner organisations and has been very effective in supporting partners to achieve their capacity development goals.

287 Australian volunteers completed **311** remote and **32** in-country assignments.

266 assignments started this year and 77 continued from the previous year.




